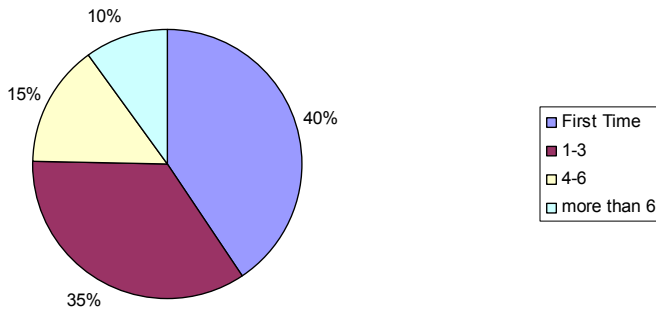

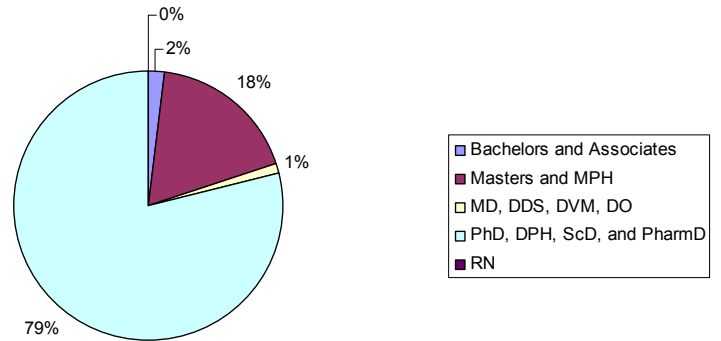

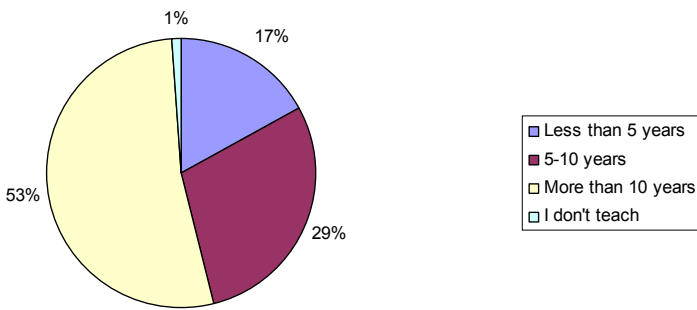
**Number of ASMCUE Meetings Attended**



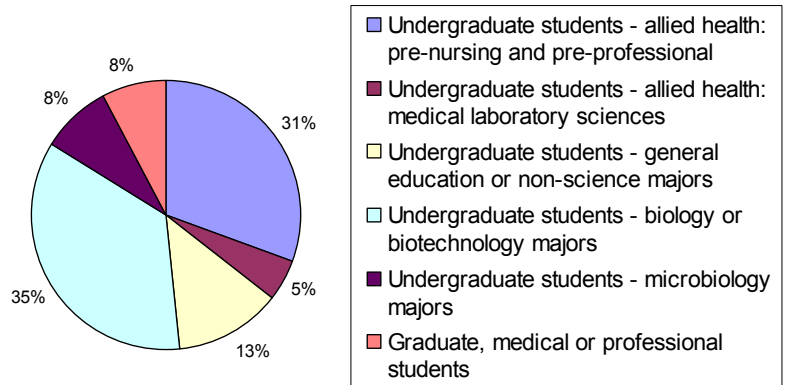
**Highest Degree Acheived by Attendee**



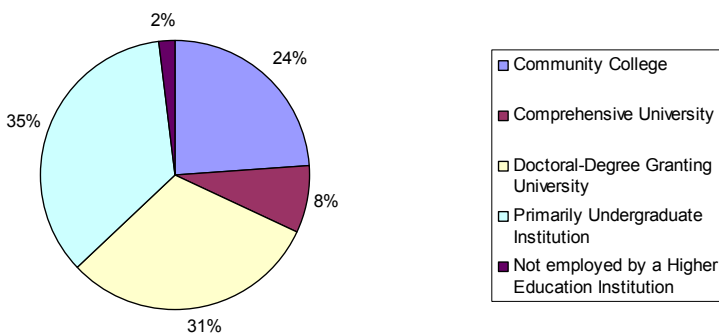
**Attendee Length of Teaching Services**



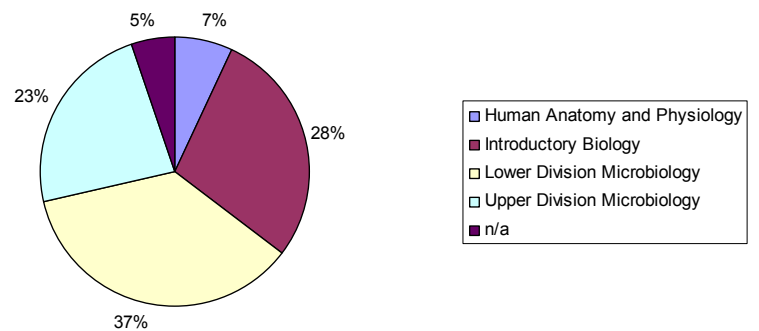
**Primary Student Audience of Attendees**
