**Submit a proposal for one of the following sessions presented at ASMCUE:**

**Learn Something New Symposia (LSN) – *Science updates***

60-minute sessions dedicated to enhancing participant's knowledge of current topics in biology and science education through lectures given by the leaders in these areas. Presenters will be encouraged to actively engage participants in their presentations. This session is presented twice during the meeting.

**Try Something New Symposia (TSN) – *Pedagogy practices***

60-minute sessions dedicated to presenting practices and pedagogies that have been assessed for classroom effectiveness. Presenters will provide background information and their approach to the strategy, leaving time for participants to practice and reflect upon how they can implement the new practice or approach into their classrooms. This session is presented in two of three offerings during the meeting.

**Nuts & Bolts Sessions (N&B) – *Career development tools***

60-minute sessions dedicated to presenting topics and information to enhance participant's professional skill sets and scholarship. Presenters will provide background information to tools, resources, and references for advancing in the profession. This session is presented twice during the meeting.
